Espionage, whether conducted for economic or national security purposes, challenges society. Corporate espionage essentially describes illegal and unethical activities undertaken by organizations to systematically gather, analyze and manage information on competitors with the purpose of gaining a competitive edge in the market.

### **Corporate espionage: The insider threat - Akanksha**

Native-born American spies were more likely to volunteer to commit espionage, since only 17% were recruited by foreign intelligence while 68% volunteered. Similar small proportions of naturalized and native-born citizens were recruited by a friend or family member (naturalized=12%, native-born=15%).
