Public participation results in better decision making. It can make the decision-making process easier not harder. Although the front-end planning can be lengthier and more complicated, subsequent steps are often more efficient and some sources of delays can be avoided.

THE ROLE OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE IMPACT ASSESSMENT

Public participation contributes to better decisions because decision-makers have more complete information – in the form of additional facts, values, and perspectives obtained through public input – to bring to bear on the decision process.
